Situation Profile

The earthquake of 8 October 2005 caused heavy life losses and mass destruction of properties and livelihoods. Although the affectees needed immediate relief goods for their survival, however, it was badly needed to enable the survivors stand on their own feet once again. A good approach to rehabilitate the people was to convert the challenges into opportunities through a long term planning for restoration of their livelihoods on sustainable basis.

For the planners, policy makers and development workers, it would be useful to know that nature has endowed the territory of AJK with abundant natural resources of forest lands, agricultural lands, water reserves, diversified agro-climates, wild life, fisheries, minerals, and a hard working human resource. Whole territory of the State of AJK mainly comprises of Himalayas, and Hindukush mountain ranges stretching from North to South. The characteristic landscape and climatic conditions offer a high potential for growing variety of fruit plants on commercial basis. Homestead gardens and kitchen gardening have been an important rural activity and an integral part of farming system in the remote areas. However, in addition to other reasons, a considerable amount of fruit produced is spoiled before and after harvest due to lack of storage facilities and marketing mechanism. In spite of having all these strengths and opportunities; farmers cannot fetch reasonable economic returns from their fruit harvests. The phenomenon forces the communities to shift their focus on alternate income sources and they do not rely on fruit industry as a sustainable livelihood.

Keeping all that situation in picture, need was identified to arrange such training courses for the rural communities which could enable them to preserve their different kinds of fruits to save from losses and to design such marketing methods and ways that communities could raise their financial health.

CSP organized four training courses on fruit processing, preservation and marketing in district Bagh AJK for female CBOs members. A unique methodology was adopted for the conduct of each training course to make them more useful. This comprised of two phases, i.e.;

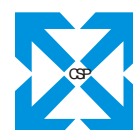
Phase-I: A 3 days formal on-campus training with extensive theoretical and practical learning hours for fruit preservation techniques.

Phase-II: Seven days practical exercises/activities in the field for exploring marketing opportunities/techniques.

More than 279 female participants from female CBOs (68 in each course) were trained during the program activities.

OBJECTIVES

Women folk being half of the rural population remained the main focus of these training courses. The main objective was to save the fruit which may be spoiled as a result of field and storage losses. The program included transfer of some modern techniques of fruit preservation at domestic level to the rural women of the farming communities of district Bagh AJK.

The specific objectives were set as follows;

- To review local and women related income generation opportunities.
- To get knowledge of benefits of fruit preservation at commercial, semi-commercial and non-commercial levels.
- The modern methods and techniques used to preserve fruits in different ways for long time utilization.
- Preserve seasonal and non-seasonal fruit successfully for their domestic consumption and commercially by using modern methods of fruit preservation.
- To establish linkages with markets for the sale of their product.

If the trained participants fully utilized the skills learned during training on fruit preservation will hopefully increase their income level, reduce their poverty to some extent, manage the livelihoods on sustainable basis, promote market mechanism, will encourage local level employment attitudes, reverse the resource losses, and increase the economic activity at the village level. If the trainees are followed up properly, the whole program may act as a role model for other areas. That may open new horizons for future planners and donors to initiate development interventions in coming projects.

Training Methodology

Four training courses were organized on demand coming from the female communities. That is why community participation was ensured at every stage of training. Training material (as training manual, file cover, writing pad and pencil) were developed with coordination and consultation of officials of CISP/LG & RDD before the implementation of training program. Community Development Officers (CDO) and Community Organizers (COs) of CISP and CSP field team nominated the interested and suitable female candidates from female CBOs in consultation with respective community activists. CSP selected the training venue, menu for the participants and accommodation for CSP field team who served as resource persons, support staff and field assistants.



Participant's registration was done by Madam Nazia Fruit Preservation Training Assistant (Annexure A). The attendance of the participants was taken on specified sheet (Annexure B). All the training activities were monitored very closely and feedback of each session was taken on evaluation proformas circulated to all the participants. The coming sessions on the

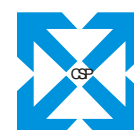


following days were made more effective in the light of comments registered by the participants through these forms (Annexure C). Every day, training session started at 09:00 a.m. and was closed at 03:00 p.m. The interaction between participants was ensured through intensive group discussions, brainstorming sessions, and question-answer sessions. Participants were given practical exercises and asked for group presentation.

Trainers used to deliver lectures on the first day of the every training event and the second day was reserved for practical exercises of fruit preservation methods. Participants were asked to demonstrate these methods on third day of every training course. At the end of every training course, CSP Field Assistants provided technical assistance to most of the interested trained community activists in the establishment of fruit preservation centres at their respective villages. Mr Khurshid Ahmed Deputy Director CISP/LGRDD monitored the training program activities.

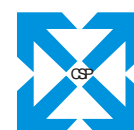

- At Bagh, an exhibition was organized in collaboration with CISP/LG&RDD/Agriculture department and CBOs which was visited by more than 300 public representatives.
- More than 11 sign boards addressing fruit preservation centres at village level were displayed at various places
- 36 banners were also displayed at various public places having messages regarding fruit preservation and marketing at local and national level.
- Course completion certificates and training manuals were distributed among the 279 female community activists (specimen is attached as annexure D).

Proceedings of the Course

Registration:

Before the formal conduct of course, each participant was given a set of training material comprising of training manual, file cover, writing pad and pencil. Participants were registered through filling registration forms given to everyone.

Introduction:

The course formally started with recitation of few verses of Holy Quran by one of the participant. Then each participant introduced herself. It was a homogeneous group of young women found ambitious for learning fruit preservation techniques through the training course.



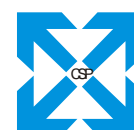
Expectations:

Participants normally come up with some fears and expectations from the training course they are going to participate. For the professionals engaged in human resource development, it is a useful practice to get familiarized with those fears and expectations. This feed back helps to incorporate the necessary changes/adjustments in the training methodology, contents, or any other event to make that training more effective and useful. Some norms are also set before the formal commencement of course. For this purpose, the participants were divided into three groups and asked to write down their possible fears and expectations on flow charts. After group work, these charts were collected and discussed thoroughly. Later on, these charts were pasted on walls of training hall. The following expectations were noted down from the group work;

- 1- To learn new methods of fruit processing and preservation
- 2- Capacity building regarding marketing of fruit preserved
- 3- Getting introduced new methods of fruit and food processing
- 4- To ensure the implementation of training at field level
- 5- Promotion of awareness regarding fruit preservation
- 6- Training should be beneficial to uplift the standards of common life.

Fears:

- 1- The duration of the training could be too short, to achieve the objectives.
- 2- Transfer of knowledge would not be as good as needed
- 3- The atmosphere of training might not be suitable
- 4- Tea and lunch might not be arranged properly
- 5- Participants fail to preserve local fruit as off season is there

Setting Norms:

1. Participants have to follow the time schedule during the course
2. Full concentration should be paid to each training session.
3. An overall discipline should be maintained
4. During question/answer session, one should speak at one time
5. There must be positive criticism (in any) and only for earning
6. There would not be display of any political and religious affiliations
7. Everyone has to respect others point of view
8. All mobile phones should remain off
9. Everyone has to attend both the theoretical session and practical work

Course Introduction:

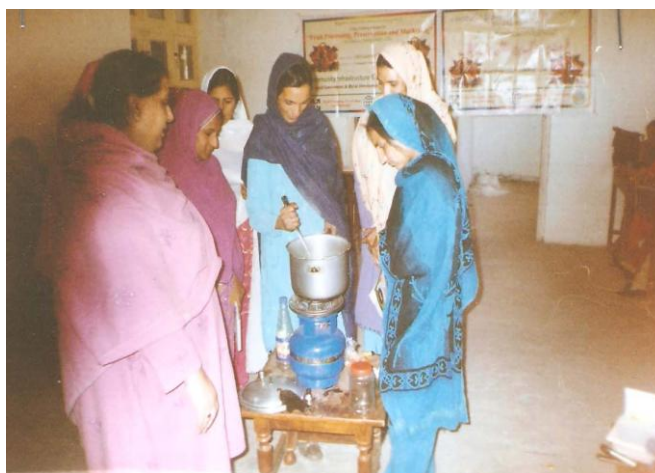
Mr. Raja Maqbool Hussain Assistant Director Agriculture welcomed the participants and thanked for their participation in the training course. He explained the objectives, and outlines of the course. He introduced the participants with total fruit production in AJK, the amount and types of fruit losses occurring every year and the reasons of these losses. He explained the importance of fruit preservation and its need as a sustainable livelihood for the rural women. He pointed out certain local fruits, which could be preserved and marketed in the local and national markets. He covered all the theoretical aspects of fruit and vegetable preservation in AJK. He also highlighted the process of coordination mechanism between CISP/LG & RDD, CSP and agriculture department that made possible to organize such a valuable training activity for the rural women. While explaining few lessons learned through his professional experience, he shared some success stories and examples of some failures for the guidance of participants.

Practical Exercises:

Madam Shazia Jamshaid Technical expert started the most relevant session and assigned the participants to identify the local fruits especially the fruits that could be used to preserve in any shape of local culture. The most of the participants identified a long list of local fruits but failed to share experiences regarding fruit preservation.



On the second day of each training course, Madam Shazia Jamshaid used to demonstrate practically the preparation of fruit jams, jellies, pickles, ketchups and other dishes prepared by fruits. She also shared some interesting experiences regarding fruit preservation and marketing. Similarly, the participants what so ever they had learned the previous day kept every third day of training for the practical demonstration. Participants showed keen interest during the practical exercises and prepared many every product, which they learned.

All the training sessions were closely monitored and evaluated. For this purpose, the participants were circulated evaluation proformas (in Urdu language) at the end of each session. In the light of feed back taken from these proformas, the coming sessions were to be made more effective. Participants were appreciated if they participated in discussions.

Exhibition:

On third day of training at Bagh, an exhibition was organized to promote the local fruit preservation methods and marketing at local and nation level. The trained female community activists from Dheerkot and Bagh displayed many products prepared by preserved fruits and vegetables. More than 300 female and male community activists, key social



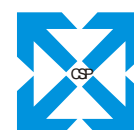
personalities, business men, officials of line departments, principals of boys & girls colleges, Administrator Municipal Corporation Bagh, representatives from local NGOs & CBOs etc. visited the exhibition and also purchased the fruit products prepared by the communities. Mr. Muhammad Hammayun Khan Project Director CISP/LG&RDD inaugurated the exhibition. He appreciated the work of organizers and female community activists for their active participation in the exhibition. He explained that CISP is going to extend for further three years in which female participation would be compulsory at every stage of the project activity. This activity proved to be a potential source of encouragement for the trained activists who had established fruit preservation centres at their respective villages.

Establishment of Fruit Preservation Centres:

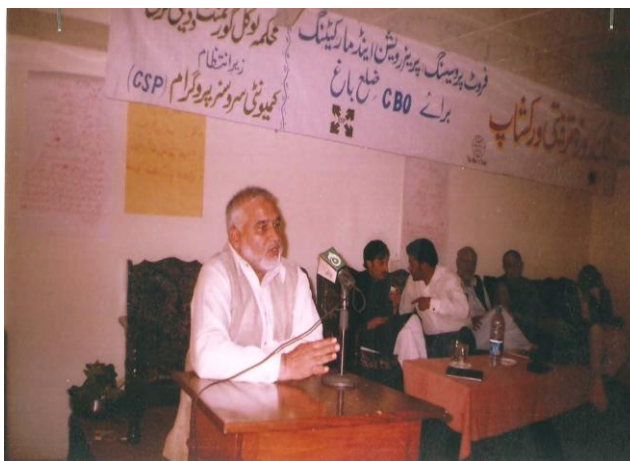
At the end of every training event, CSP field assistants supported the interested community activists in establishing community fruit preservation centres at village level. At these centres, trained female will display preserved fruits like jam, pickle, dry fruits and vegetables. These centres will be supportive for preserved fruit marketing at local and national level.

As an out come of these training courses, CSP was able to establish 11 Fruit Preservation Centers in district Bagh (4 at Deheer kot, 5 at Bagh and 2 at Farward Kauta). Mr .M Hammayun Khan PD CISP/ LG&RDD visited one centre at Bagh along with his monitoring team during his visit at Bagh AK. CSP fixed signboards for each centre pointing out title FRUIT



PRESERVATION CENTRES at respective villages. These signboards would be helpful for the people to identify the fruit preservation centre in the villages as a part of accessible marketing. In addition, CSP also displayed 48 banners having motivational slogans and messages to mobilize communities and businesspersons for promotion of this activity at their respective areas for income generation activities, especially for women. Local NGOs and line departments had appreciated this activity.

Monitoring:

Mr.Khurshid Ahmed Deputy Director Human Resource Development (Dy Dir. HRD) CISP/LG&RDD was deputed to monitor the entire training program at district level.

He monitored the whole program with keen interest and represented CISP/LG&RDD with full concentration. He spent all the time with field staff and provided his expertises whenever needed. He personally visited the fruit preservation centers established by CSP field team and community members with deep concern. Monitoring and program completion report is attached with as Annexure E.

Evaluation:

Training program was thoroughly evaluated by the M.Hammayun Khan Project Director CISP/LG&RDD, Mr. Tahir Iqbal Account Officer and Mr. Khurshid Ahmed DD HRD CISP/LG&RDD jointly during their visit to Bagh. They appreciated the program and recommended some extra activities to be done in future by CSP.

The community also evaluated training program itself, as they liked that and demanded such type of workshops to be arranged in future also. Press and electronic media (Newspapers and TV) had given it special coverage in their special additions.

At the end of every training event, evaluation forms were distributed among the participants to assess the training program achievements. Most of the participants responded satisfactory and some demanded more such type of trainings in near future.

Lessons Learned:

There is a plenty of preserve able amount of local fruit and vegetable. However, lack of awareness and marketing methods were identified as main reasons for the spoilage of such a big income resource. Community activists are interested to preserve fruit and vegetables at local level but are unable to initiate fruit preservation and its marketing. It was also observed that relevant line departments lack the technical expertise as required in this context. Local NGOs have not sufficient resources to support and adopt it as a part of income generation activity to make it sustainable.

Recommendations:

1. Internal personal contacts with the community

This is the most effective technique of establishing credibility of CISP/LG&RDD, winning confidence, mobilizing, inspiring, and involving community in the fruit processing, preservation and marketing at either local or international level and preparing it to take over the sub projects.

2. Walks

Awareness walks should be organized in different cities. The community members, especially female participation in the walk should be ensured. Local politicians, social workers, and civil society should also be persuaded to join/ lead the walk.

3. Lobbying.

CISP/LG&RDD should arrange seminars, orientation workshops and exhibitions in collaboration with line departments particularly agriculture department for awareness rising. At the same time female should display fruit preserved products at the specified public places.

4. Printed Material

Printed materials like booklets, leaflets, brochures, and posters having fruit preservation and marketing messages should be produced for the guidance of CBOs, community key persons and general public.

5. News letter

CISP/LG&RDD should publish a monthly bulletin/newsletter in Urdu and English languages. It should focus all the stake holders and CISP. All the news related to fruit preservation and marketing activities carried out by female activists along with pictures should be published in this News Letter. It should be circulated to all CBOs of AJK
